Each original transcription includes historical and performance notes.

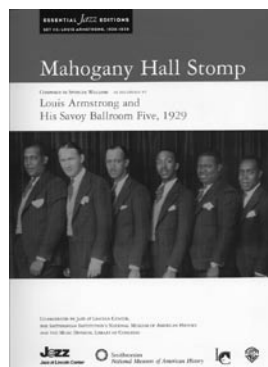
